Vision of CSO's

Joint visions: ICN2, CFS, CONCORD



- Human rights and rights-based approach to food and nutrition security;
- Coherent and coordinated management of nutrition throughout the lifecycle and at all levels;
- Sovereign local food and agricultural systems based on agro-biodiversity;
- Democratic governance of food and nutrition and global and national regulatory framework.

Roles of CSO's



Concord (NGO network): As a group of NGOs we recognise it is essential that we ourselves are in solidarity with the self-organised movements of people most affected by hunger and malnutrition

Outreach and based in the (most affected) communities

- Lobby and advocay: Claim rights, policy advises
- Implementation and facilitation and strenghtening of local CSO's

ICCO: Food and Nutrition Security Program



Strengthening CSO's (both nationally and locally) is central to the program in order to:

- Develop and strengthen local and sustainable food systems (from producers to consumers): Agriculture, alternative incomes, employment, nutrition awareness
- → Benin: all members ICCO FNS coalition now eligible for WB funds to improve nutrition
- Claim rights and propose (alternative) policies at national, regional and global levels
- → Gender!

Example national program



Integrated program in Uganda:

- Nutrition education and messaging
- Local and regional value chains: eg. orange fleshed potatoes and chili
- Production improvement and diversification
- Policy interaction (local)

Nutrition Governance



CFS is the foremost inclusive global platform working on food security and nutrition issues at international level

Right based approach: advocacy for enabling environment
Financial resources
Accountability
Local ownership

CONCORD paper: Justice, democracy and diversity in our food system

Nutrition Governance



In the next biennium Nutrition will be major work stream in CFS, plus will be standing issue for the longer term

Many actors have asked for a discussion about : Good nutrition in changing food systems



Partnerships



Nutrition brings on board many actors, including private sector actors

Profit making, adding value → income → food and nutrition security (under certain conditions)

- Adding value as low in the chains as possible
- Product development
- → Reaching the BoP (consumers and producers)

Private sector could bring in resources, including knowledge

But.....

Governance: who controls the food system

Conflicts of interest: not easy, don't close your eyes...systemic issue?!

Eg. CSR policy: also for NGO's who work with companies

"traffic light system": exclusion and inclusion policy
